Board Policy: 1. For pupils in all grade levels and programs offered by the Charter School, the maximum length of time that may elapse between the time an assignment is made and the date by which the pupil must complete the assigned work shall be twenty (20) school days.

- The Principal or designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the best interests of the 2. pupil to remain in the independent study upon the following triggers:
- a. When any student fails to complete one (1) assignment during any period of twenty (20) school days.

Supervising Teacher.

- In the event, a student's educational progress falls below satisfactory levels as determined by ALL of the following indicators:
 - The pupil's achievement and engagement in the independent study program, as indicated by the pupil's performance on applicable pupil-level measures of pupil achievement and pupil engagement set forth in Education Code Section 52060(d) paragraphs (4) and (5).

- ii. The completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the pupil is working on assignments.
- iii. Learning required concepts, as determined by the Supervising Teacher.
- iv. Progressing toward successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the Supervising Teacher.

A written record of the findings of any evaluation conducted pursuant to this policy shall be treated as a mandatory interim pupil record. The record shall be maintained for a period of three years from the date of the evaluation and, if the pupil transfers to another California public school, the record shall be forwarded to that school. The Charter School shall comply with Education Code Sections 51745 – 51749.3 and State Board of Education regulations adopted thereunder.

Statement of Academic and Other Supports for Special Populations: The Charter School shall utilize the tiered re-engagement process to address the needs of pupils who are not performing at grade level, or who need support in other areas, such as English Learners, pupils in foster care or pupils who are experiencing homelessness, and/or pupils requiring mental health support. The Charter School complies with the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act ("IDEA") and is committed to meeting the needs of individuals with exceptional needs in order to be consistent with the pupil's individualized education program ("IEP"). Policies, procedures, and guidelines are in place to ensure that pupils are identified, assessed, and provided a free appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. The school complies with Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Sec. 794) and is committed to providing equivalent access to and providing free appropriate public education to all students with disabilities.

<u>Voluntary Statement</u>: Independent study is an optional educational alternative in which no pupil may be required to participate. In the case of a pupil who is referred or assigned to any school, class, or program pursuant to Section 48915 or 48917, the instruction may be provided to the pupil through independent study only if the pupil is offered the alternative of classroom instruction.

<u>Pupil-Parent-Educator Conference</u>: Upon the request of the parent or guardian of a pupil, before signing this written agreement the Charter School shall conduct a telephone, videoconference, or in-person pupil-parent-educator conference or other school meetings during which the pupil, parent, or guardian, and, if requested by the pupil or parent, an education advocate, may ask questions about the educational options, including which curriculum offerings and nonacademic supports will be available to the pupil in independent study, before making the decision about enrollment or disenrollment in the various options for learning.

Equitable Provision of Resources and Services: The independent study option shall provide appropriate existing services and resources to enable pupils to complete their independent study successfully and shall ensure the same access to all existing services and resources in the school in which the pupil is enrolled as is available to all other pupils in the regular school program.
